Van Buren County school board votes 6-1 to 'retire' Hartford Indian mascot

VAN BUREN COUNTY, MI — A school board in Van Buren County voted this week to stop using the name "Indians" as the district's mascot.

The Hartford Public Schools Board of Education voted 6-1 to "respectfully retire" the Hartford Indian and related images during a Nov. 22 meeting, a press release from Superintendent Kelly Millin said.

The Pokagon Band of Potawatomi Indians Tribal Council supported the removal of the mascot after nearly 6,000 Pokagon citizens voiced opinions on the issue, according to a letter from chairwoman Rebecca Richards. Many Pokagon citizens live in the Hartford community, the letter said.

The school board decision came after residents were able to voice their opinions during a public comment time.

The mascot will be retired at the end of the 2021-2022 school year.

A new mascot will be chosen through a student-led process with input from the community and stakeholders, the release said.

Some K-12 school districts across the state continue to use Native American mascots and imagery, despite growing calls for those schools to rebrand.

Hartford is one of eight Michigan K-12 schools that call themselves the Indians, including Athens, Chesaning, Newberry, Tahquamenon, Tecumseh, Tekonsha and White Cloud.

Last year, Saugatuck Public Schools announced that it would drop its team name as the "Indians" in an effort to promote a learning culture that values diversity, equity and inclusion. After a months-long search process, the district landed on "Trailblazers" as its new team name and mascot.
